





Living Environment Factors Which Influence Physical Activity



Neighborhood conditions which promote physical activity

- ? multi-use community design which places housing near shopping, entertainment, and other services, reducing the need for people to drive
- ? features such as parks, recreational facilities, public restrooms, wide sidewalks, walking paths
- ? "active transportation" alternatives: bike lanes; pedestrian routes, public transportation
- ? a crime-free environment in which residents are not afraid to spend time outside their homes
- ? a community where outdoor activity does not expose residents to injury due to falls, animal attacks, or traffic accidents

- ? There is NO risk-free level of contact with second hand smoke.
- ? Eliminating smoking in indoor spaces is the only way to fully protect nonsmokers from secondhand smoke exposure.

- ? More deaths are caused each year by tobacco use than by all deaths from HIV, illegal drug use, alcohol use, motor vehicle injuries, suicides, and murder **combined**.
- ? Nearly one of every five deaths each year in the U.S. is related to adverse health effects from cigarette




