JOSEPH S. WOOLFORD, M.D. 1898-1957


Dr. Woolford was a graduate of Louisville Medical School in 1927 and served his internship and residency at Letterman General Hospital in San Francisco, with advanced training at the University of Chicago. He was the first physician in the Eureka area to limit his practice to radiology and organized the Roentgenology Department at The General Hospital. Dr. Woolford was a leader in the medical profession and was active in community and political affairs.

Dr. Woolford was a member of the Rotary Club of Eureka from 1934 to 1957 and held the membership classification for Radiology. He was a respected member of the Club and it was, as a member of the Student Awards Committee, that his interest in young people and their education became apparent. He was interested in the practical, physical, measurable type of individual performance that reflected quality and excellence.

The Joseph S. Woolford, M.D. Trust provides that all income is to be distributed annually to Humboldt State University, an educational institution, to be used by said institution for the giving of One Thousand Dollar (1,000) fellowships to Humboldt State University students chosen and recommended for such fellowships by the Student Awards Committee of the Rotary Club of Eureka. The first fellowships were given in 1976 and by the end to the fourth year eighteen had been given. The annual income determines the number of fellowships. The trust is administered through the Trust Department of the Bank of America, Eureka, California.


The fellowships are being granted to Humboldt State University graduate students. Applications are requested from the processed through the Office of the Dean, Graduate Studies and Research. The Graduate Council screens the applications and selects nominees for the Joseph S. Woolford, M.D. Rotary Club of Eureka Student Fellowship. The Student Awards Committee of the Rotary Club of Eureka checks qualifications, conducts interviews and selects recipients to whom fellowships are to be given. The Club's Board of Directors passes on the final fellowships.

The desire of Dr. Woolford to recognize and reward quality and excellence of individual performance and contribute to the furtherance of academic pursuit are an integral part of the section process.
