Protecting Patient Dignity

By being a member of CMA, your doctor protects your health care rights should you be too sick to speak for yourself. CMA sponsored California's Health Care Decisions Act (2000), which reaffirmed the Advance Health Care Directive as the legally recognized way to write a living will in California.
